1. Read Advent - We Prepare for Jesus and answer questions
2. The Birth of Jesus! worksheet
3. Complete Advent ornament activity
 - a. Color ornament
 - b. Cut it out (adult supervision please)
 - c. Hole punch the top of ornament
 - d. Use a piece of string to place through and tie into a knot
 - e. Place on tree

Advent - We Prepare for Jesus

Advent is the first season of the Church Year. It is a four week season of hope and expectation. It is a wonderful time of preparation for the great feast of Christmas. Advent is a time of reflecting on all that the coming of Jesus means to us and to the world. We are to live Advent. We are to reach out to others during this season and bring them hope. We are to share God's love.

The scripture readings for the first half of Advent speak to us of hope for the future. We focus on the coming of Jesus at the end of time. We live in constant hope and expectation of living with Jesus in glory. The readings for the second half of Advent focus on the coming of Jesus at Bethlehem. God's promise to his people was fulfilled in a way more glorious than anyone could have expected: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (John 3:16). We celebrate all that Jesus' coming means to us.

Jesus is the light of the world. The candles that we light during Advent remind us of his coming as the light of our lives. Uncovering these themes of Advent help children learn that they are to follow him always in all things. Through prayer, service, and participation, children learn the fruits of living in hopeful expectation of the Messiah. Come, Lord Jesus.
